- The Celadrin Tigerettes are a group of six women, 60 to 70 years of age, united by their love of basketball
- They are based out of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and have been competing together for nine years.
- Their overall record is 132-3; the team remained undefeated their first 58 games and have not lost a game in over 4 years.
- They competed and won gold at the Senior Olympics in Orlando, Florida, in 1999 and again in Norfolk, Virginia, in 2003. They will compete at the next Senior Olympics in Louisville, Kentucky, in July 2007.
- They were named champions of the Huntsman World Games in St. George, Utah, which took place in 2000 and 2006, earning them the title of “World’s Best Grandma Basketball Team” by Dick Rosetta, writer for *The Salt Lake Tribune of Utah*.
- Among the team members, they share four U.S. Olympic Gold Medals and 54 state and regional medals.
- For the Tigerettes, exercise, involvement, sports and a positive attitude are a wonderful outlet. The team gets together three times a week for stretching, weight training, practice and pick up games with the young guys at the gym.
- When the Tigerettes are not practicing, they are babysitting their many grandchildren, shopping, traveling and playing other sports.
